

Pronouns Reference

Personal Pronouns (most common):

	Singular	Plural
First Person	I, me	we, us
Second Person	you	you
Third Person	he, him, she, her, it	they, them

Possessive Pronouns: my, mine, your(s), his, her(s), their(s), our(s)

*That book is **mine**.*

*He forgot **his** jacket at home.*

Reflexive & Intensive:

First Person	myself, ourselves
Second Person	yourself, yourselves
Third Person	himself, herself, itself, themselves

*Reflexive - Tara enjoyed **herself** at the party. The team prided **themselves** on their victory.*

*Intensive - I **myself** cooked that delicious dinner. Did you redecorate the room **yourself**?*

Demonstrative: *this, that, these, those*

This is the book I bought for my sister.

Are **those** the kinds of plants that bloom at night?

Interrogative: *what, which, who, whom, whose*

What is the best brand of frozen yogurt?

Who wrote Barrio Bay?

Indefinite: *all, each, many, nobody, other, any, either, more, none, several, anyone, everything, most, no one, some, both, few, much, one, somebody, anything, something*

Both of the girls forgot their lines.

I would like **some** of that chow mein.

Relative: *that, which, who, whom, whose*

Exercise is something **that** many people enjoy.

Thomas Jefferson, **who** wrote the Declaration of Independence, was our country's third president.
